CLERGY COLUMN

A MESSAGE FROM RABBI MARK MILLER

I recently came across a beautiful poem by Rabbi Harold Schulweis:

It is Never Too Late

The last word has
not been spoken,
the last sentence has
not been written,
the final verdict is not in.

It is never too late
to change my mind,
my direction,
to say no to the past
and yes to the future,
to offer remorse,
to ask and give forgiveness.

It is never too late
to start over again,
to feel again
to love again
to hope again ...



The poem reflects one of the essential truths of Judaism that we sometimes forget as we enter into the High Holiday season. We tend to have high expectations, and put a lot of pressure on ourselves when we arrive to celebrate the New Year. We are told that "the gates open" on Rosh HaShanah and close on Yom Kippur - and it is up to us to effectively make teshuvah (repentance) before the time is up. Except that our tradition also teaches that the gates don't really close at the end of Yom Kippur. If we aren't quite done, they stay open for us through the holiday of Sukkot. And if we still haven't finished, we get another chance at Simchat Torah. And even if that isn't enough, we can take advantage of Shabbat.

Rabbi Schulweis is gently reminding us that God is always there for us, whenever we are finally ready to do our part to look inward, assess ourselves, and commit to a better future.

But in our eagerness to lower the barriers and invite any degree of engagement among our community, I think he ignores another vital truth: It is also never too soon to start again! Yes, we will have another opportunity. Sure, we will always be welcome. And yet, when we are left with no sense of urgency, it is too easy to put things off indefinitely.

Teshuvah is not merely an ancient ritual ... it is a crucial element in our human quest to live a good and balanced life. No matter how successful we may be, no matter how much we may struggle - every one of us benefits when we take advantage of the reflective process that Judaism has perfected over thousands of years.

Next month, as we prepare to enter the Jewish year 5779, I wish for you and your loved ones a season filled with prosperity, love, and the joy of personal growth. On behalf of Rachel Ann and our boys, an early Shanah Tovah!





The much-dissected Pew Research Center study of 2013, "A Portrait of Jewish Americans," revealed that most American Jews consider their Jewishness as rooted in their ancestry and culture, not in their practice of the religion. Abigail Pogrebin wondered if that's because we haven't looked at religion closely enough. Her curiosity led her to embark on an entire year of intensive research, observation, and writing about the milestones of the Jewish calendar. *My Jewish Year* travels through the calendar's signposts with candor, humor, and a trove of information. It captures the arc of Jewish observance through the eyes of a relatable, wandering — and wondering — Jew. The chapters are interspersed with brief reflections from prominent rabbis and Jewish thinkers.







Facilitated by Eileen Polk, MLIS


In this moving graphic memoir, Eisner Award-winning writer and artist Michael Kupperman traces the life of his reclusive father, the once-world-famous Joel Kupperman, the "Quiz Kid." Joel Kupperman became one of the most famous children in America during World War II as one of the young geniuses on the series Quiz Kids. Following a childhood spent in the public eye, only to then fall victim to the same public's derision, Joel deliberately spent the remainder of his life removed from the world at large. Now Joel is slipping into dementia, and he seems to embrace it, as it means that the past he would never talk about might be erased forever. *All the Answers* is both a powerful father-son story and an engaging portrayal of what identity came to mean at this turning point in American history.

This bestselling author and rabbi's profoundly affecting exploration of the meaning and purpose of the soul was inspired by the famous correspondence between Albert Einstein and a grieving rabbi. Einstein's words perfectly captured what she has come to believe about the human condition: That we are intimately connected, and that we are blind to this truth. 


MONDAY, APRIL 29

The Weight of Ink: A Novel BY RACHEL KADISH

Set in London of the 1660s and the early twenty-first century, this winner of the National Jewish Book Award and a USA Today bestseller is the interwoven tale of two women of remarkable intellect. Ester Velasquez is an emigrant from Amsterdam who is permitted to scribe for a blind rabbi just before the plague hits the city. Helen Watt, an ailing historian with a love of Jewish history, is summoned by a former student to view a cache of newly discovered seventeenth-century Jewish documents. When she enlists the help of Aaron Levy, an American graduate student as impatient as he is charming, she embarks on a last project: to determine the identity of the documents' scribe, the elusive "Aleph." Electrifying and ambitious, *The Weight of Ink* is about women separated by centuries, and the choices and sacrifices both must make in order to reconcile the life of the heart and mind.




MONDAY, JUNE 24

Last year, Don and Margi Epstein were the very deserving recipients of the President's Cup, for their lifelong commitment and dedication to this institution.

This year, in what will be my last act as your President, I went in a different direction in determining the winners. Being at Temple as often as the President is, you see a lot of the same faces every time you walk through these doors. Many of the same volunteers, many of the same congregants at services on Friday evenings and Saturday mornings. All of these faces remind me of the vibrancy of the TBE community as a whole, but there were two individuals who really stood out. These two people made transformational changes to the Temple, and their positive

energy, radiance and ability illuminate these halls.

It is with great pleasure that we recognize two members of the Temple staff we honor Morris Collins and Susie Weiner with the 2018 President's Cup.

Morris and Susie, you each bring so much joy to all of our lives.

Morris, I refer to you as the greatest "Director of First Impressions" I've ever known. You have an ability to know all our names, and who belongs to who (which kid belongs to which parents or grandparent.) And you greet each and every person who steps into our Temple like you've known them your whole life. But, even more than that, in a world where threats lurk in every direction, you keep us safe. We all know that you take the security of our community to heart and are very serious about our safety. If there is someone Morris doesn't know, they

don't get in. If you're parked in the parking lot in the middle of the afternoon, Morris is watching.

Over the past few years, Morris has taken on even more responsibility, overseeing the security team as a whole, working with his counterparts at Jewish Federation and local police departments, and always striving to make sure that we are protected under his watch.

Morris, thank you so much for making such a remarkable first impression for Temple Beth El, for lighting up all our lives, and for protecting our loved ones day in, day out.

Susie, as the Director of our Early Childhood Center, or ECC, has the unimaginable job of educating our youngest members. I've said many times over the past two years that engaging and educating our pre-school kids is the most critical responsibility we have in securing our future as a synagogue. It's, of course, these young children that will grow up to become the future leaders of the Jewish community tomorrow.

A few short years ago our ECC, while running smoothly, was at a crossroads. Marlene Thav, our longtime Director, had announced her retirement and the transition was far more difficult than we'd imagined. Parents weren't happy. Teachers weren't happy. Our enrollment numbers dropped significantly, and we were unsure of our next move. Other synagogues within the Detroit community were closing down their ECC's, referring their members to look elsewhere.

The first director we chose to replace Marlene gave it her best, but it didn't work out. We were back at "square one"

and didn't know where to turn. And then – the rain stopped, the clouds parted – Susie Weiner joined the TBE family. Susie stepped in, and the infighting between teachers stopped. Parent complaints and dwindling enrollment stopped. In fact, I started getting phone calls from parents saying how great the ECC experience was, how much their

child had come out of their shell, and that they'd even referred a friend. The Executive Committee started getting reports that ECC numbers were increasing.

Listen to these numbers: The ECC had 85 children enrolled at the end of the 2015/2016 year. They had 95 children enrolled at the end of 2016/17. And this year, just last week actually, we ended the 2017/2018 school year with 108 students.

Susie, I just want you to know how thankful we are to have you as our ECC Director. Our Early Childhood Center is the talk of the town and the envy of every other institution.

Morris Collins and Susie Weiner, it is my absolute honor to present you with the 2018 President's Cup. Thank you both for making our future more secure.

DEEP ROOTS & RICH HISTORY

TEMPLE BETH EL

When I was 25, I went on a singles' mission to Israel. We did all the usual activities, like climbing Masada and floating in the Dead Sea. But one experience, in particular, had a profound impact on me: I planted a tree. I remember taking hold of my little sapling, choosing the perfect location amongst the others, digging a hole, and then I planted it with love. To me, it symbolized a future of growth and prosperity.

That was many years ago. Today I like to imagine how much it's grown, how deep its roots reach, and how wide its trunk has become now that it's a mature tree. I can almost picture it there still, providing shelter and oxygen, representing in my mind permanence, vitality, and strength of will.

Temple Beth El reminds me of my tree in Israel, with its deep roots, strong branches, and rich history. As most of you know, Temple was the first Jewish congregation in Michigan. It was founded in Detroit in 1850 when there were only 60 Jews living amongst a total population of 21,000. During the early years, our Temple leaders strayed from the strict Orthodox rules by adding music to their services and became one of the original pioneers of the Reform Movement. And throughout our 168 year history, TBE has maintained its visionary ways, adapting to the changing needs of our Jewish community while remaining an unwavering pillar of Jewish traditions and values for generations.

My husband J.J. and I have four kids: Ruby, Lacey, Skylar, and Nathan. You can imagine how crazy our house was when they were younger. It was kind of like the monkey exhibit at the Detroit Zoo. Lots of playing, running around and screeching at each other. To alleviate the almost constant bickering, I came up with an idea, a reward system really, meant to help promote more peaceful sibling relationships.

The reward system worked like this: JJ or I would award a ticket to anyone who stopped what we called the “vicious cycle of negativity” or did a random act of kindness. Let me explain. A vicious cycle of negativity goes kind of like this: “That’s mine!” “No, it’s not!” “You’re a jerk!” “You’re a loser!” and so forth, like a never-ending

game of pong. So, I would say, "Who's going to stop the vicious cycle of negativity?" They'd pause, think about the ticket, and inevitably one of them would say, "Ok, let's start over" or "I'm sorry." A ticket was then issued. I'd write their name on it, place it in a box, and each Friday we randomly picked a winning ticket for a prize. It was a huge success!

In today's society it's more important than ever to promote kindness and tolerance. Every day we are inundated with negativity on the TV, in newspapers and on social media. You can't avoid it, and worst of all, its contagious. It can cause us to feel bitter and angry, which we then spread to others. It snowballs like the vicious cycle of negativity with my kids, and it has to stop.

Regardless of what's going on in my life, I make an effort to look on the bright side, be respectful, and focus on the good. I hope that by spreading a positive attitude I can make a positive impact on my family, my friends, and my community.

I recently found out that the Hebrew word "chesed" (CHE-said,) which means "loving-kindness," is written in the Torah more than 190 times. According to the Rabbis, loving-kindness is considered the most important of Judaism's ethical virtues.

As President, I will encourage these types of Jewish values, because in addition to our all-too-real responsibilities (think budgets, fundraising, and security) there must be some thread of the Divine underlying everything we do as a Temple and as a community.

Going back to my tree in Israel, it's written in Proverbs that the practice of Judaism and its traditions are "a tree of life to all who grasp it, and whoever holds onto it is happy; its ways are ways of pleasantness, and all it's paths are peace."

I'm not a Rabbi, but my takeaway is this: if we let TBE be our community's "tree of life," if we hold onto its sturdy roots and stretch our own branches up toward the spiritual world, we'll find more happiness and a greater sense of fulfillment.

So please, let our incredible staff, clergy, lay-leaders and congregants be part of your lives. We'll elevate your mind, body and spirit with programs such as our Food Truck Festival, the outdoor Music Shabbats, including our annual



Shabbat in Charlevoix, and new this year, a Bark Mitzvah dog parade. Come take part in whatever interests you! If you don't see anything you like in the Bulletin or on TBEonline.org, call me. I'd love to hear your ideas and suggestions.

I'd like to thank you all of you for the honor of electing me President of our Temple Beth El. Our Temple continues its history of robustness, dynamism and innovation while upholding our deep historical values and roots. And, like the tree of life, our spirit is ... growing!



YOUR TEMPLE WORKING FOR YOU

Temple Beth El has 168 years of history, nearly 1,100 member families, and a calendar packed with opportunities to connect, learn, celebrate, and volunteer. But just as important, our Temple is here to provide resources, guidance, rituals, and spiritual counseling for a range of special moments throughout your lifetime. Each month, this page will help you explore the various aspects of what Temple has to offer, with specifics about how to take advantage of your membership. **For example:**

BRIS/BABY NAMING: Special ceremonies at Temple, your home, or elsewhere to bless a new child, give them a Hebrew name, and welcome them into the Covenant of the Jewish People.

ANNIVERSARIES: Beginning in 2018, we will honor those celebrating "quinquennial" (every 5 years) anniversaries with a special blessing on the *bimah* during a Friday night service. For those married 50 years or more, please let us know so we can prepare a special gift – you are an inspiration to us all!

BLESSING YOUR HOME: A *mezuzah* can make a house feel like a Jewish home, and our clergy are available to help you affix a *mezuzah* with a simple ceremony to bless your home.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING: Life is filled with beauty, but it also contains difficulties. Judaism has a lot to offer, and our compassionate clergy are here to talk with you confidentially about any emotional, spiritual, or religious concerns you would like to discuss.

ELDER CARE: No matter how much we love our aging family members, it can be overwhelming to deal with the emotions that come with changes in their needs and abilities – Temple is here to help.

HOSPITAL VISITS: Whether you or a loved one are in the hospital for surgery, illness or another reason, we are here to offer comfort, spiritual guidance, and practical support. Our clergy visit hospitals throughout the metro area regularly, and are ready with a prayer, song, or gentle conversation.

SHIVA CORPS: After a funeral, it is customary to gather for *Shiva* to share stories, comfort one another, and join together for a brief service. In addition to our clergy, the TBE Shiva Corps is a group of volunteers who are ready to provide an opportunity to share memories and say Mourner's *Kaddish* surrounded by community.

UNVEILING: Near the end of the first year after the death of a loved one, we return to the cemetery for an "unveiling" ceremony to install and bless a permanent marker at the gravesite.

The much-dissected Pew Research Center study of 2013, "A Portrait of Jewish Americans," revealed that most American Jews consider their Jewishness as rooted in their ancestry and culture, not in their practice of the religion. Abigail Pogrebin wondered if that's because we haven't looked at religion closely enough. Her curiosity led her to embark on an entire year of intensive research, observation, and writing about the milestones of the Jewish calendar. *My Jewish Year* travels through the calendar's signposts with candor, humor, and a trove of information.
