



A MESSAGE FROM RABBI BRUDNEY



SHALOM L'CHULAM — **GREETINGS TO ALL**

In the Jewish calendar, perhaps even more than in the secular calendar, it feels like we're always ending one holiday while preparing to ramp up for another. I'm not the first to notice this phenomenon, which explains the existence of www.isitajewishholidaytoday.com, a real website addressing this very subject.

In fact, we're currently in the midst of the seven weeks between Passover and Shavuot. These 49 days aren't quite a holiday, but certainly they're an elevated time: our omer. Every night during omer we're commanded to say a brief blessing and then to announce the count. It's as simple as it sounds: "Today is day three of the omer," etc. A traditional way to add meaning to this process is by adding a kabbalistic interpretation of the meaning of each day. Many people take advantage of the opportunity that omer presents and dedicate these 49 days to focus on something important to them. For instance, one might write a daily journal, learn a new text, or name something beautiful they saw that day before counting the omer.

This year I'm focusing my personal omer count on growth — noting any change and/or improvement that I've seen in myself and/or others every day. This formal count of 49 days ends with Shavuot on the evening of May 19th.

As many of you know, just a month later I will be getting married, certainly one of the most important personal changes/improvements in life. For me, this certainly adds to the anticipation of the omer count, knowing that when it comes to an end, the wedding countdown begins!

My fiancé Zach Berg and I would like to invite all in our Temple Beth El community to share in our joy by joining us on Friday evening, June 22nd, for an aufruf followed by a special oneg. I am so thankful for the warmth with which this community has embraced us both, and we look forward to celebrating with you all.

May all in our Beth El family experience moments of great simchah along our omer count.

SHARING WEDDING JOY



There is no occasion quite like a wedding, and one of the most stressful parts often can be deciding how to create your list of invites! A wedding is an incredible celebration among family and friends, but one that is necessarily limited. However, Jewish tradition also envisions an opportunity to share the joy of a wedding with your entire community.

It's called an *aufruf* – which literally means "calling up" in Yiddish, and refers to a wedding couple who is called up to the *bimah* during a Shabbat service before their wedding. The goal is to spread the word about the joyous occasion, and for the entire community to share in a blessing that will send bride and groom into a successful marriage.

At Temple Beth El, more and more couples are taking advantage of this wonderful opportunity to add to their wedding day by coming to Temple with family and friends for a public blessing. It can take place on a Friday night or a Saturday morning, and we are more than happy to personalize the occasion to your particular desires. Temple Beth El has 168 years of history, nearly 1,100 member families, and a calendar packed with opportunities to connect, learn, celebrate, and volunteer. But just as important, our Temple is here to provide resources, guidance, rituals, and spiritual counseling for a range of special moments throughout your lifetime. Each month, this page will help you explore the various aspects of what Temple has to offer, with specifics about how to take advantage of your membership. For example:

BRIS/BABY NAMING: Special ceremonies at Temple, your home, or elsewhere to bless a new child, give them a Hebrew name, and welcome them into the Covenant of the Jewish People.

ANNIVERSARIES: Beginning in 2018, we will honor those celebrating "quinquennial" (every 5 years) anniversaries with a special blessing on the bimah during a Friday night service. For those married 50 years or more, please let us know so we can prepare a special gift – you are an inspiration to us all!

BLESSING YOUR HOME: A *mezuzah* can make a house feel like a Jewish home, and our clergy are available to help you affix a *mezuzah* with a simple ceremony to bless your home.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING: Life is filled with beauty, but it also contains difficulties. Judaism has a lot to offer, and our compassionate clergy are here to talk with you confidentially about any emotional, spiritual, or religious concerns you would like to discuss.

ELDER CARE: No matter how much we love our aging family members, it can be overwhelming to deal with the emotions that come with changes in their needs and abilities – Temple is here to help.

HOSPITAL VISITS: Whether you or a loved one are in the hospital for surgery, illness or another reason, we are here to offer comfort, spiritual guidance, and practical support. Our clergy visit hospitals throughout the metro area regularly, and are ready with a prayer, song, or gentle conversation.

SHIVA CORPS: After a funeral, it is customary to gather for *Shiva* to share stories, comfort one another, and join together for a brief service. In addition to our clergy, the TBE *Shiva* Corps is a group of volunteers who are ready to provide an opportunity to share memories and say Mourner's *Kaddish* surrounded by community.

UNVEILING: Near the end of the first year after the death of a loved one, we return to the cemetery for an "unveiling" ceremony to install and bless a permanent marker at the gravesite.



ACTLY ARE THE ARCHIVES?

I have been the Curator at Temple for 8 months now. After I explain to friends, family, and others who I tell that I oversee the Prentis Memorial Library and Leo M. Franklin Archives, I get one of two reactions: either a head shake and a "wow, that's cool," or the more thoughtful "what does that mean...what exactly ARE archives?"

I've realized that archives have a "speakeasy" feel – you only know they exist if you actually know they exist. Growing up here at Temple, I passed the archives room hundreds of times without knowing what was inside. So now I'll let you in on the secret: Beth El has an amazing collection of remarkable historic materials on the second floor of our building, and on display in the Library and around the Temple. Even more amazing...you have access to them!



"In the course of everyday life, individuals, organizations, and governments create and keep information about their activities. These records may be personal and unplanned—a photograph, a letter to a friend, notes toward a manuscript—or they may be official and widely shared—financial and legal documents, recordings of public speeches, medical files, and electronic records. These records, and the places in which they are kept, are called archives, and archivists are the professionals who assess, collect, organize, preserve, and provide access to these records." (Society of American Archivists, 2016)

How old are the archives at TBE?

The Temple archives were created in 1981 by members Miriam and Aid Kushner with materials dating back to Beth El's founding in the 1850s.

What do we have up there?

We preserve several congregant historic family collections, the TBE Building Collection, Rabbinic Collections, the Cultural and Art Collection, the Jewish War Veterans of Michigan Collection, the Bar/Bat Mitzvah Collection, manuscripts, oral histories, telegrams from Albert Kahn, audio and video tapes of services, and much more.

And...what is in a collection?

Great question! It could be anything from board minutes to personal letters, or photos to manuscripts and sermons. Unlike a museum that collects and displays objects, the focus of an archives is to preserve documents that help tell the story of our community. We do have some objects, like ritual pieces and a baton used by a congregant that conducted the Detroit Symphony Orchestra (what?! amazing!), but for the most part our materials are documents and photography stored in various folders and boxes that form a collection.

Do we only collect things from TBE's history?

Actually, no. Due to our status as the oldest Jewish congregation in Michigan, we have a state-wide collection policy. We collect from other congregations who may not have archives, or that have closed and want their collections preserved. Ever notice the Temple Beth Jacob presidents photographs in the hallway by the stairs? That is a perfect example!

Who uses and visits the Archives?

We have a wide range of inquiries and visitors that come to the archives. Many community members and Beth El descendants use our family and lifecycle records to piece together genealogy projects. Other visitors




are university students using our primary sources for research and to answer questions about Detroit, Jewish, and Michigan history. Another group is independent researchers, professors or historians, completing work where Temple Beth El or its members play a role. Our extensive collection dating back to the 1850s makes The Leo M. Franklin Archives a resource for Temple members, community members, and beyond.

Why keep an archives?

Archives promote awareness and provide evidence of the activities of the institution and the individuals they serve. Our Franklin Archives do something special for our community: They help us to remember those who came before us and built Temple Beth El from a small house downtown to the incredible landmark building we have today. They keep the memory of our family members and their accomplishments alive for the future. The Archives preserve our collective history as the oldest Jewish congregation in Michigan, and allow future generations to learn about the contributions that this Temple and its members have made to the community.



Meet our TEACHERS

We hope you enjoy reading these highlights of those who so influence our tiniest tots. his month we're kicking off a new feature in the Bulletin where we meet the teachers of our Early Childhood Center (ECC) that do so much to create a warm, welcoming and fun environment for our tots. We wanted to get to know more about them, so we asked about their connection to Temple, their favorite thing about the age group they teach, their favorite Jewish holiday and food, and most importantly, all the "whys" for those choices.

Wendy Hamburger is a first year teacher here at TBE yet, has many years of teaching experience under her belt. For years she has volunteered weekly at the Glazer School in downtown Detroit. Wendy is one of the reason Temple Beth El has such a wonderful connection to this Detroit school. For years her daughter Paige worked in our ECC Summer camp. Paige thought her mom might like to sub here sometimes. After subbing all last year, Wendy became a head teacher in the White room (called "Lavan," Hebrew for the color white) with children 2 – 3 years old. Her love of children is a joy to watch!

Here's what we learned about Wendy:

- She's a fifth generation member of Beth El. She attended Sunday school, was a Bat Mitzvah, went through confirmation and graduation, and then got married here. Her children went to the ECC and are following in her steps.
- It's exciting for her to watch kids at this age transform and develop; she loves being a part of it!
- Hands down, her favorite holiday is Passover: The whole family is around the table together.
- Lemon tea water is something she loves.

RACHEL HOLLANDER

When interviewing for the position last spring, Rachel told us that in working at TBE she'd be fulfilling her life-long dream of becoming a teacher. She explained that she's had a classroom set up in her parents' basement since she was three years old! Rachel is only with us for this year, as she starts medical school at MSU in the fall, but during this short time she's been a force to be reckoned with. We're so glad she joined our ECC team and taught 2–3 year old kids in the blue room, Kachol, before starting her medical studies.

Here's what we discovered about Rachel:

- Rachel, too, is a fifth generation TBE member. She was a Bat Mitzvah here and loves being back as a teacher.
- Her favorite thing about teaching this age group is getting to see how their minds work. They see things in ways that adults generally don't.
- Passover is also her Jewish holiday of choice. Why? Because of the collaborative Dayenu mural
 made by the entire school, both children and teachers, that's now hanging in our ECC hall. She
 even brought her family by to see it over Passover break. They loved it, too!
- The food Rachel loves most is cake. As with all the best things in life, it makes her happy!

This year at the Temple Beth El ECC my staff and students created an interactive, completely inclusive, and hands-on Passover mural. It all started a month before the holiday when two of the teachers, Alexis and Sara, went to library time and saw a huge box from a delivery of a new large TV. They looked at each other and thought we can do something with that, right? They took the huge box back to their room and just thought about it.

A week later Alexis Noel, a first year teacher at TBE ECC said, "Sara, this Passover story is your story and my story. Let's create something with all of the classes and all the kids." Both teachers slept on it for a couple more nights. Alexis came back to Sara and said, "How about a long hallway mural that tells the Passover story and has cool things to see and touch as the kids build it and walk through?"

Then the most amazing thing happened. Alexis got the entire staff to take part and problem solve, and everybody got excited. Each classroom took ownership of a plague or of the jellyfish creation. Just like with the children, certain teachers got more involved than others. The finished project is not only gorgeous, but more importantly, reflects the input of the entire staff and student body. Everybody feels connected to the mural because THEY helped create it.

And nobody wants to take it down....Dayenu. Thank you, Alexis Noel, for your vision, creativity, and energy. Come and take a look..

L'Taken Trip by Ari Richardson

y L'Taken trip in Washington D.C. was perhaps the most tiring weekend of my life, but also the most rewarding. The environment at the Religious Action Center was extremely welcoming, and it was clear from the start that everyone cared deeply about the welfare of America and Israel.

We chose topics that we wanted to learn more about, including reproductive rights, immigration and gun control. Not only did we learn about these issues, but also what, if anything, the government is doing in their regard. There are so many crucial problems in our country that most of us aren't aware of. For instance, did you know that Congress promised to pay 40% of special education funds, but is only paying 15%? I chose to lobby for disability rights in D.C. because I found this unacceptable. In our discussions we talked about how different parts of the Jewish community felt about this. The most important thing was that one perspective wasn't being forced onto us; we were given enough information to form our own opinions.

In the Torah it says, "You shall not curse the deaf, and you shall not place a stumbling block before the blind." As people and as Jews, L'Taken felt it was our responsibility to stand up for those who are being put down.

Recent events have ignited the voices of our young generation, and through L'Taken I was able to channel my voice to where it mattered most. It was a busy weekend, but never did it feel like work. Everyone in charge was easy to talk to and passionate about political topics. I wrote a speech and presented it to the staff of my senators and state representative. The best part was that I was treated as an equal. Everyone listened and responded to my ideas in a serious and professional manner. I know that words are powerful tools, but I never dreamed that mine had the potential to make an impact.

Because of this experience with L'Taken I'm considering a future in political science. I would absolutely recommend this trip to any teen who wants to make a difference and have their voice be heard.

MASA: GUIDING YOUR JEWISH JOURNEY

Temple Beth El runs a high quality religious school program that engages learners in experiential learning, designed to inspire personal journeys and strengthen the community bond. Our "Religious School" educational programs, however, are not what is typically thought of as "school." Our students don't sit at desks; we give no tests or homework. And so this year our mission was to find a new name to call our program that would reflect it more accurately. After much discussion by our Education Committee and staff, we decided to call our programs for grades K-12 Masa. Masa is the Hebrew word for journey, and it captures the essence of what we are striving for. Every Jew is on a journey exploring how best to engage in Jewish living. While one person may engage more through prayer and spirituality, another may be motivated by Tikkun Olam, acting to improve our world. While some students may love Jewish music or drama, others may be intrigued with rabbinic texts. There are many ways to connect with Judaism; our program strives to guide our students and their families by exposing them to multiple entry points and moving them along a path filled with discovery and meaningful Jewish engagement.

So, beginning in Fall 2018, instead of Religious School, our families will wake up on Sunday mornings to attend *Masa*, and our teens will come on Monday evenings for *Masa* Teens. Still left to decide is what our new logo should be. 


